Our beloved father, grandfather, and great-grandfather, Ike, age 92, died peacefully in his home on November 26, 2018.

Ike was born in Provo, Utah to Carl and Altania Olson. He was the sixth of seven children. His life was filled with adventures and challenges. At the age of 8 he and his cousin, Ferron, age 12, herded sheep in the hills of Vernon, Utah, for an entire summer alone together. After that experience he felt he could handle any job without any problem. He overcame polio in his youth and still enjoyed a full active life. His family gave him the most joy, and they will remember his service to them and others, his precocious teasing, and his positive attitude. Ike lived life to the fullest and endured it well, no matter the circumstances.

Ike was an electrical contractor and started I-D Electric with Richard Jensen in 1969; they were lifelong friends. After he retired he met Simon Aardema who taught him leather work. He made saddles, bags, belts, wallets, and puttered in his leather shop. Ike enjoyed this hobby until the day he died. Ike was a WWII Veteran and served in Nome, Alaska during the war.

Ike married Joyce Allred and together they raised 5 boys. They later divorced. He then met and married Carol Brockbank Gray who brought 6 more children into Ike's life. Together they had 53 grandchildren and 98 great-grandchildren. He served three missions to Sweden, his ancestral home, and loved the Swedish people. One as a young missionary, and two with Carol. Ike was a faithful member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and served happily in many callings. He loved the Savior and had an abiding testimony of the Gospel.
