

Joyce Eaton Ringer
June 14, 1932 - June 23, 2022

Joyce Eaton Ringer was born on June 14, 1932, in Shelley, Idaho. She was the third of what would become a family seven girls. Her father farmed and although he tried to shield the girls from some of the dirtiest work on the farm, Joyce became well acquainted with potatoes and developed a particular hatred of the chicken coop. After graduating from high school, Joyce moved to Idaho Falls to work at the telephone company. It was there that she met Robert Ringer who had been chosen to be part of the Navy's new nuclear program and sent to train at the nuclear site in Idaho. After a whirlwind courtship of two months, they decided to marry and informed Joyce's parents that they were eloping to Elko, Nevada. They were married on Sunday, May 17, 1953, and spent a one-day honeymoon in Salt Lake City before returning to the training site where Bob had a midnight shift.

A year later their first child was born, and Bob and Joyce would eventually have five children: Michael, Peggy, Richard, Jeff and Greg. In 1954, Bob, Joyce and Michael moved to New London, Connecticut for assignment on the Nautilus, the world's first nuclear powered submarine.

The next twelve years were spent on naval bases on the East Coast, where Bob continued to serve with distinction on the Nautilus and Joyce cared for the expanding family that now included four children. Caring for the children on her own while Bob was out to sea for months at a time created a sense of independence in Joyce that she maintained her whole life. It was here also that she developed her love for lobster and a local sandwich named grinders.

In 1966, Bob left his service on the Nautilus and became the Chief Recruiter for the Navy in Kansas City, Missouri where their fifth child, Greg, was born. After his tour of duty was up, Bob decided to retire from the Navy and the family moved to Boulder, Colorado. Boulder became a cherished home for the family, and they developed a deep connection with the area. Despite their love for Colorado and its sports teams, Bob and Joyce decided to move to Utah in 2001, to be closer to their youngest grandchildren, settling in a home

with a beautiful view of Mt. Timpanogos.

Their retirement years in Utah revolved around grandkids and an expanding circle of new friends. Joyce was a devoted caregiver for Bob as he suffered with cancer the last several years of his life. A year after Bob's death in 2018, Joyce decided to sell their home and move to the Treeo complex with several friends. The last years of her life were spent there where she was surrounded by friends old and new. After a brief struggle with cancer, Joyce passed away on the morning of June 23, 2022, at her apartment.
