Julius Binder, Jr., was born on November 2, 1934, in Elko, Nevada to Julius Binder and Pauline Babette Kappler Binder. In 1941 the family relocated to Provo, Utah, where he lived the remainder of his life. He attended Timpanogos Elementary, Dixon Jr. High and Provo High School. He was a typical teenager who loved fast cars, loud music and pretty girls.

Along with other jobs, he worked as an automobile painter until he was hired by Provo City in the Water Distribution Department. He worked there until he retired.

He married Joy Davis August 1, 1973, in Provo, Utah. Later their marriage was solemnized in the Provo, Utah, LDS Temple. They were married 32 years. Joy died in February 2, 2005. Julius later married Shari N. Veteto. They were together two years, and then divorced.

Julius loved working in his vegetable garden and enjoyed sharing his crops with his neighbors. He took pride in having a beautiful yard. He loved his family and friends and was always generous in sharing whatever he had. His trust in the Lord and His plan were always evident in his life. In spite of numerous physical ailments, he was always cheerful and willing to share a joke with anyone who would listen. His smile was contagious and his hugs were fierce.

He is preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Joy; and his sister, Erika B. Dastrup (Byron). He is survived by his sister, Eleanor B. Hall (Blaine) and many nieces and nephews. His family greatly loves him. He is our Hero! He leaves a huge hole in the lives of all who know and love him.
